ONE YEAR ANNIVERSARY OF ENGR. PROFESSOR DANSHEHU BAGUDU GWADANGAJI AS THE 3RD SUBSTANTIVE VICE-CHANCELLOR, ABDULLAHI FODIO UNIVERSITY OF SCIENCE AND TECHNOLOGY, ALIERO: THE JOURNEY SO FAR

Iniversities, as centres of academic excellence, require visionary leaders of proven integrity, versatility and commitment to effectively steer them toward achieving their founding objectives. In this regard, Abdullahi Fodio University of Science and Technology, Aliero—formerly Kebbi State University of Science and Technology, Aliero is indeed fortunate to have at its helm Engr. Professor Danshehu Bagudu Gwadangaji, an astute administrator and seasoned academic, who assumed office as the 3rd substantive Vice-Chancellor on September 4th, 2024.

Within a year of his appointment, Professor Danshehu has remarkably changed the narrative of the University by strengthening key areas of operation, addressing pressing challenges and laying a solid foundation for sustainable growth. His performance stands as a testimony to the wisdom of the Executive Governor of Kebbi State, His Excellency, Comrade Dr. Nasir Idris (Kauran Gwandu), who considered his enviable track record and patriotic zeal before entrusting him with this responsibility. In fact, Professor Danshehu willingly resigned from his highly prestigious position as Coordinating Director, Infrastructure, at the National Agency for Science and Engineering Infrastructure (NASENI), an institution under the Presidency, to serve his home state and contribute to the transformation of the University.

#### STRATEGIC INTERVENTIONS AND INSTITUTIONAL REFORMS:

On assumption of office despite not receiving a proper handing-over note, Professor Danshehu wasted no time in laying down strategic modalities for his mission and vision. His first major step was the establishment of an Inventory Committee, which successfully collated and documented the University's assets across faculties, Departments, and Units. Beyond that, he inaugurated over 4D Committees, each with clear terms of reference, to address specific challenges of the institution. Some of these include the Convocation Committee, Accreditation Committee, ICT Committee, Staff Audit Committee, Accommodation and Welfare Committee, University Farm Committee, Master Plan Committee, Security Committee, Strategic Planning Committee, Environmental Sanitation Committee, Entrepreneurship Development Committee and several others.

Through these Committees, the Vice-Chancellor promoted inclusivity, efficiency, and accountability, ensuring that all arms of the University system were actively involved in charting a new course and boosting the internally Generated Revenue on Student accommodations and the Consultancy Services ltd.

#### INFRASTRUCTURE AND WELFARE:

Demonstrating his pragmatic leadership style, Professor Danshehu swiftly embarked on rehabilitating critical infrastructure. Students' hostels were renovated, faulty transformers at the administrative block and staff quarters were repaired and the long-standing financial challenge of borrowing to pay salaries was decisively addressed through a restructured Bursary

Department. He also led a strong advocacy of the University Management and Unions towards the approval and implementation of staff new minimum wage.

His administration prioritized staff and student welfare. He revived monthly imprest allocations, ensured provision of consumables for academic activities and engaged relevant stakeholders to improve students' living and learning conditions. Notably, he facilitated Kebbi State Government's support for students' health needs and securing of the Kebbi Special Hospital to serve as the University Teaching Hospital through the Ministry of Health and worked with partners to secure the disbursement of the National Education Loan Fund (NELFUND).

### PARTNERSHIPS AND COLLABORATIVE EFFORTS:

The Vice-Chancellor's leadership attracted unprecedented support from individuals, Government Agencies, and Organizations.

Senator Muhammad Adamu Aliero donated solar-powered streetlights, motorcycles, inverters, rehabilitated the University Central Mosque, pledged an official vehicle for the Vice-Chancellor and additional block of students' hostel.

Senator Abubakar Atiku Bagudu, the Minister for Budget and Economic Planning also supported the institution with solar streetlights and motorcycles to boost campus lighting and security.

The National Hydro Electric Power Producing Areas Development Commission (N-HYPPADEC), under the leadership of Abubakar Sadiq Yelwa, constructed solar-powered boreholes at students' hostels, solving a persistent water scarcity problem.

Through collaboration with Engr. Ahmed Umar Faruk, Managing Director of National Air Space Management Agency (NAMA) and other associates the University accessed a grant of N33 Million, which was judiciously utilized for projects including new University logos at the main gate and administrative block, changing the looks of the Convocation Arena, Roundabouts. The Federal Ministry of Works partnered with the institution to enhance its internal road network.

#### TRANSPORTATION AND AESTHETICS:

Under his objective decision, the University's transport system was revived. All buses, including the long-abandoned Marcopolo, were repaired and redeployed. He also enhanced the beauty of the campus by remodeling symbolic roundabouts with artistic, engineering and agricultural features.

### Engagement with Development Agencies:

Professor Danshehu's administration strengthened collaboration with agencies such as Tertiary Education Trust Fund (TETFFUND), the National Ecological Fund (NEF), National Energy Commission of Nigeria (NECON) and National Information Technology Development Agency (NITDA), securing assurances of further developmental support. His approach reflects a leadership style rooted in transparency, accountability and forward-thinking.




Indeed, his tenure so far has rekindled confidence in the institution and set a promising foundation for even greater accomplishments in the years ahead.



VICE-CHANCELLOR RECEIVES BILL AND MELINDA GATES FOUNDATION (BMGF) WAVE PROJECT TEAM

The Abdullahi Fodio University of Science and Technology, Aliero, has been recognized as one of the beneficiaries of the Bill Gates-funded Central and West African Virus Epidemiology (WAVE) grant on cassava production. The initiative was designed to address the persistent challenge of Cassava Mosaic disease (CMD) affecting large-scale cassava production in Northern Nigeria.

This groundbreaking intervention was championed by globally renowned philanthropist, Bill and Melinda Gates Foundation (BMGF), who set aside special funding to support innovative solutions in cassava virus research. Following a global call for proposals and a rigorous selection process, Professor I.U. Mohammed of Abdullahi Fodio University emerged as one of the focal points for Nigeria a milestone achievement that broughtgreat prestige to the institution.

The WAVE project has focused on key areas such as cassava virus epidemiology research, students training and capacity building aimed at mitigating and ultimately eradicating, cassava diseases. Its impact has been widely felt, with numerous cassava farmers across Northern Nigeria reporting improved yields and reduced losses, expressing further gratitude to the project's intervention.

On Wednesday, 18th June 2025, the WAVE project team, led by the Country Director, paid a courtesy visit on the Vice-Chancellor, Engr. Prof. B.G. Danshehu. The purpose of the visit

was to assess the progress made so far and to explore strategies for ensuring the sustainability of the project, which is nearing its completion. The Country Director Professor Justin Pita expressed satisfaction with the implementation of the project and hinted at plans for a possible follow-up phase, referred to as "Step B." He commended Prof. I.U. Mohammed for his dedication, professionalism, and exceptional leadership throughout the project lifecycle.

In her remarks, the Deputy Director of the project Professor Angela Eni also appreciated the unwavering support of the university's management, acknowledging their cooperation since the inception of the initiative. She further extended her gratitude to the entire project team for their commitment and teamwork.

In his response, the Vice-Chancellor, Engr. Prof. B.G. ### THE TRUE STATE OF STAFF DISENGAGEMENT BY THE UNIVERSITY

It is a well-established fact that every organization whether public or private relies on dedicated and dependable staff who can make meaningful contributions toward achieving the institution's overall objectives.

Kebbi State University of Science and Technology, Aliero now Abdullahi Fodio University is a state-owned institution where over 90% of the staff are bonafide indigenes of Kebbi State from various local government areas. This stands as a clear evidence that the University has consistently provided fair opportunities to state indigenes, irrespective of religion, ethnicity or political affiliation.

Organizational policies are continually evolving, aimed at maintaining standards and achieving set goals. While some of these policies may be favorable, others might be met with resistance or misunderstanding. Nonetheless, they are essential for institutional growth and accountability.

The current university leadership is adhering to the institution's master plan and operational standards, particularly in the light of ongoing salary deficits experienced over recent years. In response to this growing concern, the University Governing Council constituted a Committee on staff audit to investigate the actual number of staff present. The Committee undertook a comprehensive physical audit by inviting all staff members

### to appear in persons.

After concluding its assignment, the Committee submitted a detailed report to the Council. The report of the Committee was deliberated during the 42<sup>st</sup> Council meeting held on 30th April, 2025 in which the recommendations were approved for implementation.

For the record, it is important to clarify that on the issue of casual staff the Vice-Chancellor is currently on consultation with the Council, it is equally important to note that

their certificates as well as those that absconded their duty posts without official permission which constitutes gross misconduct and therefore liable for dismissal or termination of appointment as the case may be.

In the light of these findings, it is constructive to note that the decision regarding staff disengagement was made solely based on the recommendations of the Council Committee on staff Audit and was duly approved by the University Governing Council.

The situation is largely occasioned by:

- The rising cost of monthly electricity (NEPA) bills.
- Increased expenditure on the production and printing of files, letterhead papers, and related administrative materials following the recent change of the University's name to Abdullahi Fodio University of Science and Technology, Aliero.
- The need to prioritize academic programmes through the provision of consumables and utilities for the effective functioning of Faculties.

In light of the above, Management regrets that imprest allocation can no longer cover all beneficiaries as before. However, within the limits of available resources, Management will continue to address critical areas in line with operational standards, while working towards sustaining excellence in performance.
